Dear Craig School Families,

We are excited to begin a new school year at Craig! This promises to be a year filled with opportunities for all of our students as we strive to find ways that enhance our programs to be even better than before!

Last summer was such an exciting time as the renovations of the second floor came to completion. Our new space allowed our students and staff an opportunity to spread out. Now with the second floor finished, we have dedicated this summer to the enhancement and advancement of technology. Many of our current smart board projectors will be replaced with interactive white boards, eliminating the need for dedicated electronic boards or space consuming flat panels.

We have also started the Google Expedition library. The technology department has been experimenting with the Expedition programs which will first be launched in our Social Studies classes. We plan on taking virtual field trips to Antarctica or walks along the Great Wall of China. The students can explore the world from the comfort of their classroom.

The addition of STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math) to the science curriculum has given the students a taste of hands on activities that integrate the four subjects. The monthly STEM challenges will continue and to foster that momentum we have added the Little Bits Coding Kits. Little Bits is a platform of easy to use electronic building blocks for creating inventions large and small. In conjunction to the STEM Student Sets the Science department has spent time this summer linking projects with the new 3D printer to match the Next Generation Science Standard for each grade. I am sure science will continue to be the favorite of all our core classes.

Last year we began our one to one computer initiative for the 6th through 8th grade. We have found this to be very successful and will continue this program using Google G-Suite and extensions that Craig has deemed most valuable for learning. This year we will pilot the Grammarly Premium Package with our eighth grade class. A few of the options of the Premium Package are vocabulary enhancement suggestions and checks for punctuation, grammar, content and sentence structure. As we prepare our student for high school our goal is to help them access a more sophisticated tool to enhance their writing.

We have not forgotten our lower school students in our quest for writing support. We have included 40 new laptops into our inventory. Moving away from the desk top model gives more space for the classrooms to add some of the unique seating options that we offered in the second floor remodel. Our students have had a chance this year to select chairs and desks that optimize learning and attention. Three different options will be provided in each of the rooms.

At Craig we pride ourselves in helping our students develop their reading skills and hopefully find a love of reading. Before the purchase of the Wilson School we had limited space for a library. We finally have dedicated space that is taking shape. With more than 5,000 books to be put on shelves, the library has been digitized. Staff and volunteers have been scanning all of our books. Comfy furniture will be purchased to offer a warm, inviting atmosphere for our students. The entire reading department has been making a shift towards using more expository text for instruction to facilitate the development of background knowledge and vocabulary our students need. The teachers have created a list of historical novels with their matching Lexile levels and summaries which will be housed in the library for students to access.

As we prepare for our upcoming school year we are reminded that a school day is more than just academics. It encompasses the social and emotional well being of the child. Joyful engagement isn't incidental; it's essential and it is our job to enhance our students' ability to learn with as little stress as possible. Last year we began our school-wide program of mindfulness training using a combination of the Mind Up program and Calm Classroom. All students were taught simple tools for self-awareness and self management. This year the staff will continue their training with a full day workshop prior to the start of school. It is our quest to help the students approach their classroom calm but energized with a focused awareness. We are strongly committed to continue mindfulness training at The Craig School.

One of our biggest goals for the year is to help your child feel successful and achieve academically. By working together we can build lifelong learning. We welcome your participation and support during the school year. We look forward to celebrating with you the achievements of our students. Enjoy the rest of your summer.

DRESS CODE 2018-2019

Tops

Boys

- Shirts can be collared, dress crew, v-neck, or turtle neck
- All pictures and logos should be school appropriate
- No sleeveless shirts

Girls

- Shirts can be collared, dress crew, v-neck, or turtle neck
- All pictures and logos should be school appropriate
- No deep v-necks, plunging/open back, spaghetti straps, or crop tops

Bottoms

- Pants
 - Pants must be in good repair, worn at waist level and may not drag on the ground
 - No sweat pants (Grades 2-5 see Gym days section below)
- Shorts may be worn up until Oct. 15th and after April 15th
 - Bathing suits, short shorts, or cut-offs are not permitted
 - Shorts must be mid-thigh to knee length
- Hems of Skirts and dresses should be no more than 3 inches above knee

Footwear

- All shoes must have backs or straps to hold them in place

Gym Days

- Middle School students grades 6-8 must change for gym
- Grades 2-5 may wear athletic clothing on gym days

General

- Hats are not to be worn in the building
- Visible undergarments are not permitted
- Extremes in clothing or appearance, including unnatural hair color, that, in the opinion of the school, are immodest, distracting or inappropriate will not be allowed

LOWER/MIDDLE SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST 2017-2018

The Craig School provides students with binders that are a part of our school wide organizational system.

Please have your child bring the following items on the first day of school:

- Soft plastic pencil case – fits in binder
- Extra eraser tops
- Highlighters: (6-8 grades only) orange, blue, purple, yellow

Please note: We ask that children **NOT** bring in any toys, trading cards, fidget spinners, hand-held electronic games, etc. unless otherwise notified. We find these items very distracting to our children in the classroom.

All Students will be provided a locker near their homeroom, where they can store their backpacks, lunch and coats. We do not use locks on our lockers.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES/CELL PHONES:

When students arrive at school their cell phone **MUST** remain in their backpacks. Once they arrive to homeroom faculty will ask students to place their cell phones or other electronic devices not being used for academic learning in a designated place. The homeroom teachers at the end of the day will return all devices to students before dismissal. If a student is arriving late to school they can turn their phone in to their homeroom teacher before the start of their arrival day.

Students are not permitted to text others or call using their electronic device during the academic day- including calls to parents and guardians. Students may only place phone calls to parents/guardians from the social clinician's office or the nurses' office.

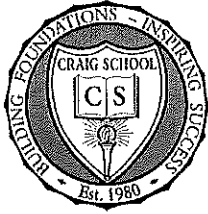
Craig School Auction

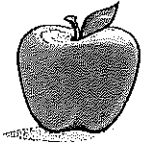

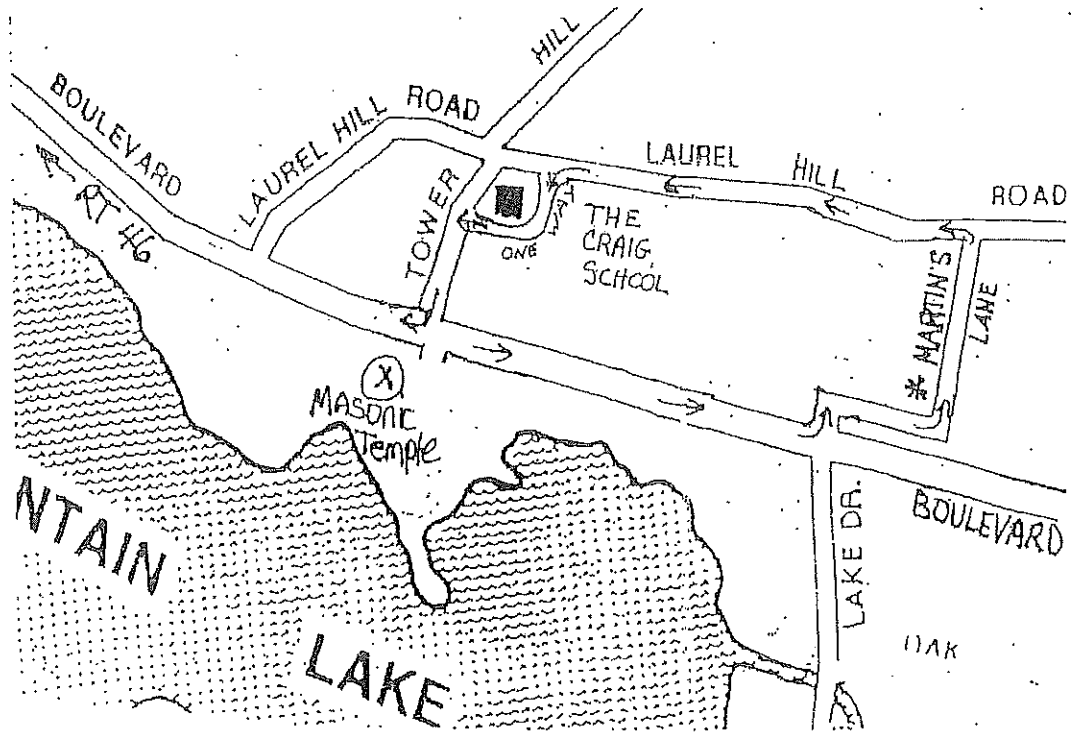


The Mountain Lakes Police Department has recommended
the following procedures for the morning drop-off and
afternoon pick-up:

- ❖ All vehicles enter Laurel Hill Road from Martin's Lane and travel south on Laurel to the School.
- ❖ All vehicles turn left onto Tower Hill Road when exiting the school driveway.
- ❖ Buses may drop off in school driveway, but they must pick up at Island Beach.
- ❖ Our driveway/parking area is ONE WAY ONLY.
- ❖ Numbered parking spaces are for Craig employees only.
- ❖ Visitor parking is for up to one hour. If you are staying at the school longer, please park across the street at the beach.
- ❖ Tower Hill Road is off limits on both sides of the street for parking, stopping and standing.
- ❖ Laurel Hill Road is off limits for parking, stopping and standing.
- ❖ Due to the congestion of the parking lot, we ask that you do not leave your car unattended.
- ❖ Please make every effort to keep the car line moving.
- ❖ Please continue using Martin's Lane traffic pattern. Tower Hill Road is a one-way (out) between 2:20PM and 3:20PM. This is enforced by the Mountain Lakes Police Department.
